PRESENT.

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act 1865, and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

ordered, as follows:—

1. The provisions made in the Order in Council dated the 24th day of June 1965 (which deals with the payment of re-engagement grants to certain categories of Naval ratings who re-engage to complete time for pension) shall so apply in respect of re-engagements entered into by eligible ratings on or after the 22nd March 1966 as to make grants of £750 payable in all cases except those in which the full payment of £375 grant has already been made; and, accordingly, the Schedule to the said Order shall, in respect of any grant so payable on a re-engagement entered into on or after the 22nd March 1966, be amended as follows: amended as follows:-

(1) In Clause 1, there shall be substituted for the existing words and figures the words and figures

"The re-engagement grant shall be (taxable).";

(taxable).";
(2) In Clause 2, the words and figures "£750 grant" and "£375 grant" shall be deleted;
(3) There shall be added at the end of Clause 3 the words: "Provided that any rating who has already received or is due to receive a 10% advance of a grant of £375, and had not on 22nd March 1966 completed the full period of his first engagement, shall be eligible for a further payment of £37 10s."

2. This Order may be cited as the Naval Re-engagement Grants Order 1966 and may be cited together with the Order in Council dated 24th June 1965 as the Naval Re-engagement Grants Orders 1965 and
