(ii) If, had he been invalided on the day he died, he was not eligible for a terminal grant, his widow may be paid a gratuity in accordance with the following scale:

- 25. Where, had the Officer or seaman or marine been invalided, an adjustment would have been made to his award in respect of gratuity or other noneffective payment previously received by him, an
  abatement may be made on that account in assessing
  the gratuity payable under Clause 23 or 24.
- 26. Where the Officer or seaman or marine did not leave a widow eligible for an award under this section but a child or children (as defined in Clause 20, and fulfilling the conditions of that Clause), the Defence Council may at its discretion award a gratuity Defence Council may at its discretion award a gratuity to the child or children or to any of them.
