### BILLS RECEIVING ROYAL ASSENT

House of Lords, London S.W.1. 13th December 1966.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons, by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them that the Lords authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to the Acts agreed upon by both Houses, to desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read, and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, Empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to:

Storey's Gate, London S.W.1. THE PRICES AND INCOMES ACT 1966

Notice under section 29

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that he is considering the making of an Order under section 29 of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, in the terms set out at the end of this notice, applying that section to remuneration under contracts of employment for work of the description specified in the Order.

If the Order is made an employer shall not, while the Order is in force, pay remuneration of that description at a rate which exceeds the rate of remuneration paid by him for the same kind of work within the period specified in Article 3 of the Order by any amount unless the Minister of Labour has given his consent in writing to an excess of that amount, or of a greater amount.

Any employer, or any employers' organisation, trade union, trade union organisation or other person representing employers or employees may make representations as respects the proposed Order in writing to the Secretary of State addressed to the Department of Economic Affairs, Storey's Gate, London S.W.1, within 14 days from 16th December 1966.

After the expiration of that period, and subject to consideration of any representations duly made, the proposed Order may be made in the following terms:
