HIGHWAYS ACT, 1959*The Borough of Chatham (Princes Avenue) Public Path Extinguishment Order, 1966*

SCHEDULE

1. That part of a footpath approximately 4 feet in width which runs from Princes Avenue south of Hopewell House to the south of Settington which part starts on the east side of Princes Avenue from a point approximately 300 feet south of Hopewell House leading in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately 200 feet, then south-west for approximately 440 feet, then generally east for approximately 60 feet, and thence south-west for approximately 440 feet to its junction with the footpath crossing the valley from Downsview to East Hill.

2. That part of the first above-mentioned path on the southern side of the footpath leading to East Hill which runs generally parallel with the east side of Princes Avenue for approximately 2,000 feet to rejoin Princes Avenue some 950 feet north-west of Whites Wood.

Stopping Up of Highways
