PRIVY COUNCIL OFFICE

At the Court at Sandringham, the 11th day of January 1967

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas by the Burial Act, 1855 (1855 c.128) it was amongst other things, enacted that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder or other operation of such Order should thereunder, or other operation of such Order, should or should not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, might seem fit:

And whereas an Order in Council was made on the 29th day of March, 1854, (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order") directing the discontinuance of burials in the burial ground and in the ground under the chapel of the Roman Catholic Chapel at Banbury, in the county of Oxford:

And whereas the Principal Order was varied by Orders in Council of the 12th day of August 1907 and the 15th day of August 1929:

And whereas it seems fit to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that the Principal Order as so varied, should be further varied:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:

1. The Principal Order shall have effect subject to the following exception or qualification, viz.:—

That, notwithstanding anything in the said Order in an earthen grave space in the said burial ground in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed at his decease of the body of the Very Reverend Canon Arthur Wall, subject to the condition that no part of the containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

- 2. The Interpretation Act, 1889 (1889 c.63), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 3. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (Banbury) (Variation) Order 1967.

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday the 27th January 1967, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £130,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday the 30th January to Saturday the 4th February 1967, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date. 1. 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank

of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different

dates.
5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
