

2. The length of road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order shall cease to be a restricted road for the purposes of section 19 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960.
3. The length of road specified in Schedule 3 to this Order shall become a restricted road for the purposes of section 19 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960.
4. The Interpretation Act, 1889, shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament, and as if for the purposes of section 38 of that Act this Order were an Act of Parliament and the direction revoked by Article 1 of this Order were an Act of Parliament thereby repealed.
5. This Order may be cited as the County Council of Glamorgan (Restricted Roads) (No. 1) Order 1967.

That length of the Cardiff-Llantrisant road (A.4119), at Groesfaen in the County of Glamorgan, which extends from a point 521 yards west of its junction with the Peterston-Super-Ely road (Class III) to a point 557 yards west of that junction.

SCHEDULE 3

That length of the Cardiff-Llantrisant road (A.4119), at Groesfaen in the County of Glamorgan, which extends from its junction with the Peterston-Super-Ely road (Class III) in a general easterly direction for a distance of 200 yards.

HUNTINGDON AND PETERBOROUGH COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Huntingdon and Peterborough (Fenstanton-Godmanchester Road A.604) (Prohibition of Waiting) (Clearway) Order 1967.

Notice is hereby given that the Huntingdon and Peterborough County Council propose to make an Order under sections 26 and 27 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles on the main carriageway of the Fenstanton-Godmanchester Road A.604 from a point at the Huntingdon and Peterborough County boundary near Fenstanton to Cow Lane, Godmanchester, a length of approximately 4½ miles, subject to the following exemptions:

- (a) Vehicles used in building work, road works etc., if they cannot be used for such purposes without waiting on the carriageway.
- (b) Vehicles used for Fire Brigade, Ambulance or Police purposes.
- (c) Vehicles used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets.
- (d) Vehicles used for the collection of household refuse etc., if they cannot be used for such purposes without waiting on the carriageway.
- (e) Vehicles waiting while a gate etc., is being opened or closed.
- (f) Vehicles waiting when the person in control
 - (i) is required by law to stop
 - (ii) is obliged to do so in order to avoid an accident
 - (iii) is prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside his control and it is not reason-
