The Ministry of Transport consider that a decision on the status of the roads within the ring road system should be deferred until such time as the eventual road pattern in the central area has been determined. Meanwhile these routes should be considered as the road framework within the ring road system.

Any objection to the modification should be sent in writing to The Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, S.W.1, before the 17th February 1967, and should state in full the reasons for the objection and identify the land to which it relates.

Objections cannot be entertained, however, either to the council's original proposals or to the Minister's failure to make a modification
