ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1960

he Trunk Road (Devonshire Street, Penrith) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order, 1967.

The Minister of Transport has made an Order under section 26 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960 the effect of which is to prohibit any person from causing or permitting any vehicle to wait:

- (i) on either of the sides of a length of road specified in Schedule 1 hereto; or
- (ii) on either of the sides of a length of road specified in Schedule 2 hereto:
 - (a) for a longer period than thirty minutes; or (b) if a period of less than thirty minutes had elapsed since the termination of the last period of waiting (if any) of the vehicle on that side of a length of road.

Exceptions have been provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein.
