AVted arriving here flom the Coalt of Flanders: informes us that therfeas are chere fo frozentup at the leaft league from thoat, that no $\mathbb{V}+\mathrm{flel}$ dan pals in or our $\$$ which is allib confirmed by the Douish- Pacquet boat, which going our for Nen port found the entry into that Port flopped up with lcez and was farced to retity back af ain to Dover.

Malaga, Dec. 29. Sir Thoraas allerz with a fquadron of his men of war having been renging the coalts of Barbiry and Spaits, feund none of the Turlas- to refift hims, he has lately fent in hither two prize', one a Portuguez laden with Mafts, theother an Englifh fhip, both of them reaken from the Einemy, they left Sir Thumas in chace of a Turks man of war and vifibly gaining upon tim, lo that tis believed he could handly efrape. Five French men of war are cruifing off of Cape de Gacta 3 molt of the Turks men of war are cruifing without the streights, whom if the Levant wind continues, Sit Thomas intends to look after, or otherwife to expect their retiurn, their plovifions and time being neer our.

Cadis, Kan. 13. We have yerno certainty of the return of our Nem sparn Flect, but tis believed they may atsend the arrival of the Gallions at Havana, to return thome in their company, and if fo, thay cmnor at fooneft be exp: ©ted before the end of March; we have fome jeat loufie left the Turks of Algiens (who are faid to have about 25 fail of fhips abroad, thof of them in thefe feas) may have fome defign upon this expected Ilect, which has pue us to a mose shen ufual expence in hiring, 5 lufty Merchant thips, vir. Theadins of Amfterdamt the Hercales, the sophia, the St Bernard and one more, to take in foldiers, and in compary of five Spanifh men of war to pur out tofea to meet and fecure that Flect jne rheis retura.

The Zealand Convoy arrived here the zoth pait, and fince on the git inftant the Convoy from Rotterdam; that fom Havbourg came in the oth inftant, and there is now in view before this Byy a Eleet of 22 \{ail of thips from Rotterdan, which may this evening pur into this Port.

The Mary Rofe Recr Aderiral Kempthorne came in hi her the 30 patt, having the day before had a flarp:dif. pure with 7 Turks Men of War for 3 or 4 hours, in which he brought their Admiral, Vice Admiral and another by the Lee, and forced them to quit the fight to repair their harts, which were very confideralle. Reer Admiral Kemptbornes, who behaved himfelf withmuch Conduct and Gallantry im this action, is here ordering the refiring of his thip, having had his Main mall and Mizen mait lamed, and all his Yards difabled belonging to his Main malt, Fore maftrand both the Top malts; iz men killed and 18 wounded.

The inbabitants sbout Presbourg wére during the late froft in great fear of the Trurks, whe had drawn togecher' a confiderable ft exgihfrom Newhanfella withan intention
to have taken thenpdyantage of the froft to pals the River ritasg; but the weather fuddenly changing prevented them in their defign, and ealed the people of theit fears.
