#### HONOURS AND AWARDS

The QUEEN has been graciously pleased, on the advice of Her Majesty's Australian Ministers, to approve the award of the George Medal to the undermentioned:

Clyde Spence THOMPSON of Adelaide, South Australia.

On 4th June 1966, a helicopter engaged on survey work, crashed in flames after take off about 35 miles from the Aurukun Mission. Mr. Thompson was thrown through the canopy, unhurt by the impact, but with burning petrol on his clothes.

After Mr. Thompson had extinguished the flames, by rolling on the ground, he went to the aid of the pilot, who was lying on his back about two feet from the cabin, alight from head to foot. In extricating the pilot from the blazing helicopter Mr. Thompson suffered extensive and severe burns to his hands, neck, face and head, and the whole of the front of his body. Although gravely injured himself, and despite great pain he continued for twelve hours in his efforts to keep the pilot alive.

Mr. Thompson displayed great courage and bravery and complete disregard to the safety of his own life in going to the aid of the pilot and attempting to save his life.

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday the 5th May 1967, at 1 p.m.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday the 8th May to Saturday the 13th May 1967, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.
3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank

of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount and the net amount of the specific core pounds. per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
5. Tenders must be made through a London

Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 11 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

The Import Duty Drawbacks (No. 4) Order 1967. This Order:

- (i) revokes the provisions for the allowance of drawback of import duty in respect of
  - (a) metal polish containing imported Neuburg chalk, and
  - (b) plates and trays manufactured imported pulpboard;
- (ii) increases the rate of drawback of import duty in respect of pigment produced or manufactured from imported cadmium;

(iii) reduces the rate of drawback of import duty in respect of canned or bottled foodstuffs containing imported tomato puree or paste;
