PRICES AND INCOMES ACT, 1966

Remuneration of Solicitors

Direction under section 5(4) extending the period within which the National Board for Prices and Incomes must publish their report.

Whereas the First Secretary of State and the Lord Chancellor, in pursuance of their powers under section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act, 1966, referred the above-mentioned question to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination and have published the text of the reference in the Gazette on 10th February 1967;

2. And whereas by section 5(3) of the Act, but subject to section 5(4), the Board are required to make their report so as to allow publication within three months of the said date;

3. Now therefore the First Secretary of State and the Lord Chancellor, in pursuance of their powers under the said section 5(4), hereby direct that the said period of three months be extended by three months.
