TREASURY

(being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and pay-

ment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 11 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

- 7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- 8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
- 9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

EXCHANGE CONTROL ACT, 1947

The Treasury, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by sections 37 (2) (b) and 41 (1) of the Exchange Control Act, 1947, hereby direct that the Treasury Direction given on 25th March 1942, under paragraph 3A of Regulation 3c of the Defence (Finance) Regulations, 1939 be revoked with effect from 19th May 1967.

Explanatory Note

This revokes a Direction made by the Treasury on 25th March 1942, which in current circumstances is

25th March 1942, which in current circumstances is of insignificant practical effect.

The Direction was first made under the Defence (Finance) Regulations, 1939, and published in the London Gazette. By virtue of Article 3 of the Exchange Control (Transitional Provisions) Order, 1947 (S. R. and O. 1947/2052) this Direction was continued in force as if it had been given under section 41 (1) of the Exchange Control Act, 1947.

The effect of the Direction was that, where all the personal representatives of a deceased person were resident in the sterling area, they should be treated as there resident for the purpose of receiving and making payments, notwithstanding that the deceased was resident outside the sterling area. This dispensation was necessary under the Defence (Finance) Regulations, 1939, as personal representatives would otherwise have required specific consents for nearly otherwise have required specific consents for nearly every phase of the administration of a non-resident estate. The Direction is today unnecessary because many personal representatives find it more convenient to deal with non-resident estates on a non-resident basis throughout.

The proposed Order under section 13 of the London Government Act 1963 and sections 85, 86 and 87 of the Road Traffic Act 1960 would—

(i) designate charged (metered) parking places in the highways named in the First, Second and Third Schedules hereto; and provide that parts of certain parking places named in the Third Schedule shall be treated as loading gaps;

(ii) fix the maximum number of parking bays (i.e. spaces on the carriageway in which vehicles may be left) in each parking place named in the First and Second Schedules hereto; provide that the number and situation of such parking bays in each parking place may be determined by the Corporation and provide that parts of certain parking places shall not be occupied by parking bays;

(iii) provide that the parking places may be used between the permitted hours of 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive, any such

day not being Christmas Day, Good Friday or a Bank Holiday

(a) in the case of the First and Second Schedules, for the leaving of vehicles of any class specified in

the Fourth Schedule hereto;

(b) in the case of the Third Schedule, for the leaving of vehicles of any class specified in the Fifth Schedule hereto;

- (iv) provide that any person whose usual or main place of abode is in any street or part of street described in the Sixth Schedule hereto who is the owner of a vehicle or vehicles of a class specified in the Fifth Schedule hereto may apply to the Corpora-tion for the issue of a permit in respect of that vehicle or those vehicles;
- (v) provide that subject to certain conditions, a permit issued to a licensee shall be valid for 12 months or such lesser period as may be specified therein;
- (vi) provide that a licensee shall surrender a permit-

- (a) on ceasing to be a resident; or(b) on ceasing to be the owner of a vehicle in respect of which the permit was issued:
- (vii) provide that a permit shall be exhibited on a vehicle so as to be readily visible from the front or near side at all times during which the vehicle is left during the permitted hours in a parking place described in the Third Schedule hereto;
- (viii) provide that the initial charge for leaving a vehicle in a parking place referred to in the First Schedule shall be two shillings for two hours or one shilling and six pence for one hour and thirty minutes or one shilling for one hour or six pence for thirty minutes and that such charge shall be payable on the leaving of the vehicle in a parking place by the insertion of a coin or coins in the appropriate parking meter;
- (ix) provide that the initial charge for leaving a whicle in a parking place referred to in the Second Schedule shall be four shillings for four hours or two shillings for two hours and that such charge shall be payable on the leaving of the vehicle in a parking place by the insertion of a coin or coins in the appropriate parking meter;
- (x) provide that the initial charge for leaving vehicle in any parking place referred to in the Third Schedule shall be two shillings and six pence for the duration of the permitted hours in any one day, and that such charge shall be payable before or on the leaving of the vehicle in a parking place by the insertion of a coin in the ticket parking meter relating to that parking place or any odescribed in the Third Schedule; other parking place
- (xi) provide that, in respect of a vehicle left in a parking place described in the Third Schedule, a ticket issued by a ticket parking meter on payment of the initial charge shall be exhibited on the vehicle so as to be readily visible from the front or near
- (xii) provide that an excess charge of twenty shillings shall be incurred in respect of any vehicle left in a parking place for longer than the period for which payment was made by the initial charge and that payment of any excess charge incurred shall be made to the Corporation by the seventh day following the day on which the excess charge was incurred;
- (xiii) provide for the use without payment of any unexpired time indicated on a parking meter and not used by a previous occupant of a parking bay;
- (xiv) prescribe the manner in which vehicles shall stand in parking places and as regards parking places named in the First and Second Schedules that every part of a vehicle shall be within the limits of a parking bay;
- (xv) provide that a traffic warden may remove or cause to be removed from a parking place any vehicle in respect of which certain provisions of the Order have been contravened or not complied with;
- (xvi) empower the Corporation to install parking and ticket parking meters at Parking places;
- (xvii) empower the Corporation to arrange for tickets to be available from ticket parking meters at and after 6.30 p.m. on any day to bear an indication of the following day for the purposes of the proposed Order; and

(xviii) make other incidental provision.

- The proposed Orders under section 10 of the London Government Act 1963 and section 34 of the Road Traffic Act 1960 would—
- 1. Restrict waiting by vehicles between the respective hours and on the respective days set out in Parts I, II and III of the Seventh Schedule hereto in the streets and lengths of streets specified in the said Parts I, II and III of such Schedule.

The Corporation proposes that exemptions should be provided in the Orders—

(i) to permit vehicles to wait in order to pick up and set down passengers and their baggage, to carry out essential services, or while in use by

- local authorities in an emergency;
 (ii) to permit vehicles to wait for limited periods for the purpose of loading or unloading goods in all the above-mentioned lengths of restricted streets except where the restrictions referred to in the next paragraph apply.
- 2. Restrict waiting loading and unloading of vehicles between the respective hours and on the respective days set out in Parts I, II, III, IV, V, VI and VII of the Eighth Schedule hereto in the lengths of streets specified in the said Parts I, II, III, IV, V, VI and VII, of such Schedule.
- 3. Prescribe that no person shall cause a vehicle proceeding in the street named in the first column of the Ninth Schedule hereto to proceed in a direction other than that specified in the second column of that Schedule.

A copy of the proposed Parking Places Order and a plan showing those parts of the streets affected may be inspected between the hours of 9.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive during a period of 28 days from the date of this notice, at the office of the Borough Engineer and Surveyor at Chelsea Old Town Hall, Kings Road, London S.W.3.

The plan shows in detail:

(a) those parts of the carriageway of the highways named in the First, Second and Third Schedules hereto which are comprised in the parking places

to be designated;

(b) the parts of the streets named in the Seventh
Schedule hereto where waiting by vehicles will

be restricted;
(c) the parts of the streets named in the Eighth Schedule hereto where waiting by vehicles the purpose of loading and unloading goods will be restricted;

(d) the streets named in the Ninth Schedule hereto in which one-way traffic working will be instituted.
