The Trunk Road (Various Streets, Milford Haven)
(Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State has made an Order the effect of which is:

- to revoke the Trunk Road (Various Streets, Milford Haven) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1960 and the Trunk Road (Various Streets, Milford Haven) (Restriction of Waiting) (Amend-ment) Order 1965
 to prohibit waiting:

(a) on any of the sides of road or in the length of road specified in Schedule 1 to this notice; or

(b) between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any of the sides of road specified in Schedule 2 to this notice:

(i) for a longer period than two hours; or
 (ii) if a period of less than two hours has elapsed since the termination during the said hours of the last period of waiting (if any) of the vehicle on that side of road.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle; to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle; to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the main-tenance of the road or the services therein, or to be used in the service of a local authority in pursuance

of statutory powers or duties.
