THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS ACT 1868

THE GOVERNING BODY OF HARROW SCHOOL having, on the 28th day of September 1967, in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the above-named Act, made a Statute in the terms appended hereto amending Statute 4, of the existing Statutes of the said School, the said Statute is hereby published in the *London Gazette* in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Act.

And Notice is hereby given, that any person, body of persons, or body corporate, authorised in that behalf by the said Act, may, within two months after the publication of this notification, petition Her Majesty in Council to withhold Her approval from the whole or any part of the said Statute.

STATUTE made by the Governing Body of Harrow School on the 28th day of September 1967

Whereas Statutes for the Government of Harrow School were made by the Governing Body of the said School under the Public Schools Act 1868 and approved and sealed by the Special Commissioners appointed for the purposes of the said Act on the 24th day of February, 1874.

And whereas the said Governing Body in exercise of the powers for this purpose conferred upon them by section 11 of the said Act have resolved to alter Statute 4 of the said Statutes in manner hereinafter appearing.

Be it enacted as follows:

1. The fees payable by each boy at the John Lyon School may exceed £192 per annum but shall not exceed £225 per annum.

2. In all other respects Statute 4 of the above mentioned Statutes shall remain in force.

SPEAKER'S NOTICE

By Virtue of an Act passed in the Twenty-Second year of the Reign of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria intituled "An Act to extend the Act of the Twenty-Fourth year of King George

the Third, Chapter Twenty-six for issuing Writs during any Recess of the House of Commons, whether by Prorogation or Adjournment," and of an Act passed in the 26th year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria intituled "An Act to further limit and define the time for proceeding to Election during the Recess."

I do hereby give notice that it hath been certified to me in writing under the hands of Two Members, serving in this present Parliament in the manner required by the said Act, that Rt. Hon. Tom Fraser late a Member serving in this present Parliament for the County Constituency of Hamilton hath accepted the Office of Chairman of the North of Scotland Hydro-Electric Board and has been Gazetted thereto in the *London Gazette* dated the 18th day of August 1967 and has thereby vacated his Seat, and that I shall issue my Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown to make out a new Writ for the Electing of a Member to serve in this present Parliament for the said County Constituency at the end of six days after the insertion of this notice in the *London Gazette*.

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday the 13th October 1967, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £210,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday the 16th October to Saturday the 21st October 1967, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
