7. Part of the River Wye from the A.6 road near Great Shacklow Wood, west of Ashford, to its confluence with the River Derwent near Great Rowsley, Derbyshire, together with alternative channels.

8. Part of the River Amber from a point at Ogston Reservoir to its confluence with the River Derwent near Ambergate, Ripley, Derbyshire, together with alternative channels and together also with its tributary Alfreton Brook and part of Normanton Brook from a point near South Normanton to the confluence near Amber Row.

9. Part of the River Maun from King's Mill, south-west of Mansfield, to existing main river at Edwinstowe, Nottinghamshire.

10. Part of the River Devon from Knipton Reservoir, Knipton, Leicestershire, to its confluence with the River Trent near Newark-upon-Trent, Nottinghamshire.

11. Part of Whiston Brook from a point near Mitton Manor, Whiston, to its confluence with the River Penk near Penkridge, Staffordshire, together with alternative channels.

12. Part of the River Penk from a point south of Somerford Hall, Somerford, to existing main river near Stretton Bridge, Stretton (Cannock R.D.), Staffordshire, together with an alternative channel near Somerford Hall.

13. Part of the River Tean from a point near Beamhurst Bridge, Beamhurst, to its confluence with the River Dove, north-east of Uttoxeter, Staffordshire, together with alternative channels including other outfalls into the River Dove.

14. Part of Sutton Brook and the whole of Hilton Brook from a point near Hilton Grange, Hilton, to the confluence with the River Dove near Egginton, Derbyshire together with alternative channels.

15. Part of Crane Brook and the whole of Black Brook and Bourne Brook from a point near Shensstone to the confluence with the River Tame near Fazeley, Staffordshire, together with alternative channels, including Bourne Brook Cut and the additional outfall, Mill Brook, into the River Tame.

16. Part of Soar Brook and the River Soar from a point near Mickle Hill Farm, west of Sharnford to existing main river near Narborough, Leicestershire.

17. Part of the River Blythe from a point near the reservoir at Earlswood to existing main river near Temple Balsall, Balsall, Warwickshire, together with alternative channels.
