PRICES AND INCOMES ACT 1966

*Reference to the National Board for
Prices and Incomes*

*Pay and Productivity of Industrial Employees of
the United Kingdom Atomic Energy Authority*

Following the recommendations of a board of arbitration in September 1965, the United Kingdom Atomic Energy Authority has been negotiating with the trade unions concerned a productivity agreement covering their industrial employees. These negotiations were suspended in July 1967 when the trade union side stated that they could not accept the Authority's proposals and that they proposed to submit a new claim for an increase in basic rates. They subsequently tabled claims for increases of up to £5 a week payable in two instalments over 12 months. In return they would be prepared to accept a modified version of the proposed productivity agreement.

In pursuance of their powers under section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the Secretary of State for Economic Affairs, the Minister of Labour and the Minister of Technology hereby refer to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination the pay and conditions of service of industrial employees of the United Kingdom Atomic Energy Authority and the scope for increasing productivity.
