MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT 1926

Origin Marks on Pre-packed Cuts of Imported Meat

A Draft Order in Council embodying the recommendations of the Standing Committee set up by the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, the Secretary of State for the Home Department and the Secretary of State for Scotland, on the labelling of Pre-packed Cuts of Imported Meat, has been laid before Parliament.

This Order would require all meat and edible offal when sold or exposed for sale in pre-packed form, whether wholesale or by retail, to bear the required indication of origin clearly and conspicuously marked in letters of not less than $\frac{1}{8}$ -inch in height, provided that the net weight of the meat or edible offal in the container or package does not exceed 4 lb. at the time of sale or exposure for sale, and also that for all pre-packed meat the indication of origin should be permitted to appear, in the prescribed size of lettering, on each container or package of meat.
