PRICES AND INCOMES ACT 1966

Instruction under Section 3 (2) of the National Board for Prices and Incomes

Pay of the Armed Forces

The pay of the Armed Forces was last reviewed in 1966 when, following the recommendations of the National Board for Prices and Incomes (Report No. 10; Command 2881) the Government decided to implement pay increases with effect from 1st April 1966, in accordance with the two-yearly review procedure, based on generalised comparisons with movements of pay in certain civilian occupations, which had been operative since 1958. The next review under that procedure would have been due to take effect from 1st April 1968. The Government now consider it desirable that a continuous review of the pay and allowances of the Armed Forces should be undertaken by the National Board for Prices and Incomes. For this purpose the Secretary of State for Economic Affairs has made an Order (The Prices and Incomes (Continuous Review) (No. 1) Order 1967, S.I. 1967/1581) under section 3 (1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966.

2. Accordingly, by virtue of that Order and in pursuance of their powers under section 3 (2) of the said Act, the Secretary of State for Economic Affairs, the Chancellor of the Exchequer and the Secretary of State for Defence, acting jointly, hereby instruct the National Board for Prices and Incomes to keep under continuous review the pay and allowances of members of naval, military or air forces of the Crown and of any women's service administered by the Defence Council.

Pay of University Teachers in Great Britain

The last full review of the remuneration of the academic staff of universities in Great Britain was undertaken in 1963-64 by the National Incomes Commission. Since that time the procedure has reverted to the arrangement under which increases are awarded directly by the Government after consultation with the University Grants Committee, which in turn is responsible for consulting the Committee of Vice-Chancellors and Principals and the Association of University Teachers.

2. It has been agreed between the parties concerned that the present machinery for the review of the remuneration of these academic staffs is unsatisfactory and the Government have reached the conclusion that the responsibility for reviewing this remuneration should be undertaken by the National Board for Prices and Incomes. For this purpose, the Secretary of State for Economic Affairs has made

an Order (The Prices and Incomes (Continuous Review) (No. 1) Order 1967, S.I. 1967/1581) under section 3 (1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966.

3. Accordingly, by virtue of that Order and in pursuance of their powers under section 3 (2) of the said Act, the Secretary of State for Economic Affairs and the Secretary of State for Education and Science, acting jointly, hereby instruct the National Board for Prices and Incomes to keep under continuous review the remuneration of the academic staff of universities in Great Britain.
