Public Path Diversion Order, 1967*

*Luton Rural District (Footpath No. 11—Parish of Billington) Public Path Extinguishment Order No. 1—1967.*

Notice is hereby given that on the 29th day of September 1967, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

Its effect is to extinguish the public right of way 3 feet in width running from point "A" adjacent to the south-east corner of the churchyard of the Parish Church of Saint Michael's Billington and running in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 805 feet across field No. O.S. 136 to the main road (B486) leading from Leighton Buzzard to Hemel Hempstead at point "B" north of Billington Manor and opposite to the two dwelling houses situate between the former school and Manor Farm, Great Billington.

*Newbury Rural District (Chieveley No. 1) Diversion Order, 1967*

2. Footpath No. 7 in the parish of Forest Hill with Shotover shown coloured purple between the points marked C and D on the said plan to be diverted along the line shown coloured brown on the said plan between the points marked E and F.
