The Order shall not apply to any vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes. Nor will it prevent the driving upon Low Street or Sherwood Street of any vehicle which may be garaged on either of those streets and whose only access thereto is via Low Street or Sherwood Street.
