PRICES AND INCOMES ACT 1966

COSTS AND CHARGES IN THE RADIO AND TELEVISION
RENTAL AND RELAY INDUSTRY

Direction under Section 5(4) further extending the period within which the National Board for Prices and Incomes must publish their report.

Whereas the First Secretary of State and the Minister of Technology, in pursuance of their powers under section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, referred the above-mentioned question to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination and have published the text of the reference in the Gazette on 26th January 1967;

2. And whereas by section 5(3) of the Act, that subject to section 5(4), the Board are required to make their report so as to allow publication within three months of the said date;

3. And whereas the First Secretary of State and the Minister of Technology, in pursuance of their powers under the said section 5(4), by a direction published in the Gazette on 14th April 1967, extended the said period of three months by four months, and by a direction published in the Gazette on 15th August 1967, further extended the said period of three months by three months;

4. Now therefore the Secretary of State for Economic Affairs and the Minister of Technology, in pursuance of their powers under the said section 5(4), hereby direct that the said period of three months be further extended by two months.

DANGEROUS DRUGS (No. 2) REGULATIONS
1964

*Cancellation of Suspension of Withdrawal of
Authorities*

(WILLIAM DAVID THOMPSON)

Whereas the authorities conferred by the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1953 on William David Thompson, M.B., B.Ch., by virtue of his being a duly qualified medical practitioner to be in possession of and to supply the drugs and preparations to which those Regulations applied were withdrawn in pursuance of the powers conferred on the Secretary of State by Regulation 29 of the said Regulations of 1953 by notices published in the *London Gazette* and the *Edinburgh Gazette* on 30th November 1956, the said William David Thompson whose registered address was then Chalfont, Haverfordwest, Pembrokeshire, having been convicted of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Act 1951:

And whereas it was directed by the said notice that it should not be lawful for him to give prescriptions for the purpose of the said Regulations of 1953:

And whereas the operation of the said withdrawal of authorities and of the aforesaid direction regarding prescriptions were, in pursuance of the powers conferred on the Secretary of State by Regulation 29 of the said Regulations of 1953, suspended by notice published in the *London Gazette* and the *Edinburgh Gazette* on 10th June 1960:

And whereas the said Regulations of 1953 have been revoked and by virtue of Regulation 33 of the Dangerous Drugs (No. 2) Regulations 1964 the aforesaid withdrawal, direction and suspension are deemed to have been done and given under the said Regulation of 1964:

And whereas I am of the opinion that the said William David Thompson cannot properly be allowed, for the purpose of the Dangerous Drugs (No. 2) Regulations 1964, to remain an authorised person or to give prescriptions:

Now therefore, I hereby cancel the aforesaid Notice of Suspension published in the *London Gazette* and the *Edinburgh Gazette* on 10th June 1960.
