A PROCLAMATION

TERMINATING HER MAJESTY'S PROTECTION OVER THE
PROTECTORATE OF SOUTH ARABIA

ELIZABETH R.

Whereas the territories in Arabia known as the Protectorate of South Arabia are under Our protection:

And Whereas by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means We have power and jurisdiction in the Protectorate of South Arabia:

And Whereas it is intended that the territories known as the Protectorate of South Arabia shall become independent on the thirtieth day of November 1967 (hereinafter referred to as "the appointed day"):

Now, therefore, We do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim and declare that, as from the beginning of the appointed day, Our protection over the territories known as the Protectorate of South Arabia and all functions, powers, rights, authority or jurisdiction exercisable by Us immediately before that day in or in relation to the said territories by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance or otherwise shall lapse.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this twenty-eighth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-seven, and in the sixteenth year of Our Reign.

A PROCLAMATION

TERMINATING HER MAJESTY'S POWER AND
JURISDICTION IN KAMARAN

Whereas by usage, sufferance and other lawful means We have power and jurisdiction in the Red Sea islands known as Kamaran:

And whereas it is intended that Kamaran shall become independent on the thirtieth day of November 1967 (hereinafter referred to as "the appointed day"):

Now, therefore, We do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim and declare that, as from the beginning of the appointed day, all Our functions, powers, rights, authority or jurisdiction exercisable by Us immediately before that day in or in relation to Kamaran by usage, sufferance or otherwise shall lapse.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this twenty-eighth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-seven, and in the sixteenth year of Our Reign.

ROYAL WARRANT OF
PRECEDENCE

The QUEEN has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that Margaret Isabel Lane or Ayre, wife of John Bulley Bray Ayre, Major, Royal Artillery, shall henceforth have, hold and enjoy the same title, rank, place, pre-eminence and precedence as the daughter of an Earl which would have been due to her had her father Charles Macdonald Lane, Esquire, Companion of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India survived his first cousin Lionel Walter Young Erskine, Earl of Mar in the Peerage of Scotland, and thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Earl of Mar.

And to command that the said Royal Concession and Declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms, and that a copy thereof be sent to Her Majesty's Lyon King of Arms to be recorded in Her Majesty's Lyon Office in Edinburgh.

REPORT OF THE NATIONAL BOARD FOR
PRICES AND INCOMES

The Remuneration of Milk Distributors
(Final Report)

On 13th January 1967, in pursuance of their powers under section 2 (1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the First Secretary of State, the Secretary of State for Scotland and the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food referred the question of the Remuneration of Milk Distributors to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination.

The Board has now made its final report and in accordance with section 5 (1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966 the Secretary of State for Economic Affairs, the Secretary of State for Scotland and the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food hereby give notice that the report was first published as Command Paper Number 3477 on 28th November 1967.
