Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act, or of regulations made thereunder, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within six weeks from 8th December 1967, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

THE TRUNK ROAD (LLANDEILO) (RESTRICTION OF WAITING) ORDER 1967

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State intends to make an Order under sections 1 and 3 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, the effect of which will be:—

1. to revoke the Trunk Road (Llandeilo) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1966; and
2. to prohibit waiting between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m.:—
 - (a) in any of the lengths of road or on either of the sides of road specified in Schedule 1 to this Notice, and
 - (b) on either of the sides of road specified in Schedule 2 to this notice for a longer period than 30 minutes in any one hour.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle; to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle; to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein; or to enable the vehicle to be used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

The restrictions will not apply to a stage carriage or an express carriage.

SCHEDULE 1

Lengths and sides of the Swansea—Manchester Trunk Road (A.483) (hereinafter referred to as "the trunk road"), in the Urban District of Llandeilo in the County of Carmarthen.

1. That length of the trunk road, known as Rhosmaen Street, which extends:—

- (a) from its junction with Church Street to a point 15 yards north-east of that junction;
- (b) from a point 15 yards south-west of its junction with Abbey Terrace to a point 10 yards north-east of its junction with Bank Buildings; and
- (c) from a point 45 yards south-west of its junction with New Road and Crescent Road to that junction.

2. The west side of that length of the trunk road, known as Rhosmaen Street, which extends:—

- (a) from a point 15 yards north-east of its junction with Church Street to a point 15 yards south-west of its junction with Abbey Terrace, and
- (b) from a point 10 yards north-east of its junction with Bank Buildings to a point 45 yards south-west of its junction with New Road and Crescent Road.
