(a) a length of approximately 15½ miles of the special road provided by the Minister of Transport in pursuance of the Crick (Northamptonshire)—Doncaster By-Pass Special Road Scheme 1960 (S.I. 1960/1703) (as amended by Article 1 of the Crick (Northamptonshire)—Doncaster By-Pass Motorway Amendment (No. 4) and Wadworth Interchange Special Roads Scheme 1964 (S.I. 1964/1792)) (in this paragraph hereinafter referred to as "the (No. 4) Scheme") along a part of the route described therein, beginning at its junctions, at Barlborough in Derbyshire, with the special roads on the routes described in sub-paragraphs (2)(c) and (2)(d) of paragraph 3 of the Schedule to the Crick (Northamptonshire)—Doncaster By-Pass Motorway Connecting Roads (No. 5) Special Roads Scheme 1964 (S.I. 1964/1405), and ending at the end of that route (as shortened by the (No. 4) Scheme being at a point about 1,665 yards north-east of the point where that route crosses Rakes Lane, Wadworth in the West Riding of Yorkshire); and
