## TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1962

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 153 of the above Act to authorise the diversion of a length of footpath at Gresford, Denbighshire, in order to enable development, consisting of the erection of a community centre, to be carried out in accordance with planning permission granted to the Gresford and District War Memorial Community Centre Management Committee by Wrexham Rural District Council acting on behalf of Denbighshire County Council as local planning authority.

The diversion to be authorised will involve the provision of a new footpath maintainable at the public expense, for which the highway authority is to be the Denbighshire County Council.

Copies of the draft Order and relevant plan may be obtained, free of charge, on application to the Welsh Office, Roads Division, Graham Buildings, Newport Road, Cardiff, CF2 1YU (quoting the reference RDL 37/1/441/05) and may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours at the Wrexham Rural District Council Offices, Imperial Buildings, Regent Street, Wrexham, Denbighshire, and at the address of the Clerk to the Gresford Parish Council, 4 South View, Gresford, Denbighshire, during 3 months from the date of publication of this notice.

During 3 months from the 2nd January 1968 any person may by notice to the Secretary of State, Welsh Office, Roads Division, Graham Buildings, Newport Road, Cardiff, CF2 1YU, object to the making of the Order quoting RDL 37/1/441/05.
