REFERENCE TO THE NATIONAL BOARD FOR PRICES AND INCOMES

Flour Prices

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food has received notifications under the early warning system of proposed increases in the prices of bread and flour. The notifications relating to bread prices are based upon increased costs and also upon the need, recognised in paragraph 69 of Report No. 17 by the National Board for Prices and Incomes for the baking industry to receive a return on new investment sufficients. industry to receive a return on new investment sufficient to enable it to contain costs for the future. The notifications relating to flour prices are based mainly upon the increased cost of grain following devalua-

Increases in flour prices on account of devaluation would be reflected in bread prices and the Secretary of State for Economic Affairs and the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food consider it desirable that the proposed increases in flour prices should be urgently examined by the Board. The decision on the proposed increases in bread prices will take account of the Board's recommendations on flour prices. prices.
