### DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACT 1950

Notice is hereby given in pursuance of Section 85(3) of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1950, that the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food has made the following Order:

(Statutory Instruments 1968 No. 51)

#### *The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Controlled Areas Restrictions) (Amendment) Order 1968*

This Order permits the holding of markets, fairs or sales of animals not intended for immediate slaughter within a Controlled Area for foot-and-mouth disease, subject to licensing by the Local Authority and the consent of the Minister. After such a market, unsold animals can only be licensed to be moved either to the premises from which they were brought to the market or direct to a slaughterhouse.

(Statutory Instruments 1968 No. 94)

#### *The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Imported Meat) Order 1968*

This Order prohibits the removal from store of all fresh or refrigerated meat or offal of carcasses of animals landed in Great Britain other than from countries scheduled to the order—except in accordance with a licence issued by the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food or the Secretary of State for Scotland.
