Savile Road Footpath Diversion Order, 1968

Notice is hereby given that the above Order, made on the 31st January 1968, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Its effect will be to divert the public right of way running from a point 20 feet or thereabouts to the west of Savile Road, Hebden Bridge, and opposite to the premises No. 8 Prospect Terrace, in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 17 feet or thereabouts and thence in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 82 feet or thereabouts, to a line running from the said point to the west of Savile Road in a south-south-westerly direction for a distance of 39 feet or thereabouts, and thence in a westerly direction for a distance of 61 feet or thereabouts to the point at which the new line coincides with the existing line.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected, free of charge, at the Council Offices, St. George's Street, Hebden Bridge, between the hours of 8.45 a.m. and 12.30 p.m. and 1.30 p.m. and 5 p.m. on weekdays other than Saturdays.

CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

*Rural District Council of Wantage (Upton F.P. 3)
Public Path Diversion Order, 1967*

Notice is hereby given that on the 10th January 1968, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

Its effect will be to divert part of Upton Footpath No. 3, running from where it enters Field O.S. No. 133 (Point A on the map) 50 yards north-east of the point where it crosses the Blewbury Parish Boundary south of the Sewage Disposal Works running in a northerly direction for a distance of 255 yards to its junction with Common Lane (Point B on the map) to a line running from the said Point A in a northerly direction for approximately 265 yards inside the western boundary of Field O.S. 133 to Point C on the map on the field boundary adjacent to Common Lane, and from thence in an easterly direction for approximately 45 yards to the said Point B, where it rejoins the route of the existing footpath. The new line of the path will become available for public use and the old one closed on the 7th February 1968.

PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER

*Rural District Council of Wantage (Blewbury B.R. 14)
Public Path Diversion Order, 1967*

Notice is hereby given that on the 3rd January 1968, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

Its effect will be to divert part of Blewbury Bridleway No. 14 running from Point A on the map, approximately 104 yards north-west of Churn Farm for a distance of 250 yards to its junction with C.R.B. 5 at Bohams Road, Point B on the map, to the east of Curkneil Pit to a line running from the said Point A for a distance of 235 yards in a north-westerly direction to Bohams Road at Point C on the map approximately 95 yards south of a well situated to the west of Bohams Road.
