- (3) The Ministry of Transport Highways Compulsory Purchase Order (No.) (London-Penzance Trunk Road, Plympton By-Pass) 19 , notice of which was published on 15th December 1967. This is an Order under sections 214 and 215 of the Highways Act, 1959, and under the Acquisition of Land (Authorisation Procedure) Act, 1946, which, if made, will authorise the Minister to purchase compulsorily the land and rights described therein for the purposes of:

- (i) the construction of a new length of the London-Penzance trunk road, and
- (ii) the construction and improvement of highways in the vicinity of the new trunk road.

Copies of the above-mentioned draft Orders and of the plans referred to therein have been deposited, and may be seen at all reasonable hours, at the Ministry of Transport, St. Christopher House, Southwark Street, London S.E.1, and at the offices of Devon C.C., County Hall, Topsham Road, Exeter, Devon, Plymouth C.B.C., Municipal Offices, Plymouth, Plympton St. Mary R.D.C., Treverbyn, 8 Plymbridge Road, Plympton, Devon, and of the Divisional Road Engineer, Government Buildings, Alington Road, Exeter, Devon.

In accordance with the provisions of the Special Roads and Trunk Roads (Procedure) Regulations, 1962, the proceedings under Schedule 1 of the Acquisition of Land (Authorisation Procedure) Act, 1946, in connection with the above-mentioned Compulsory Purchase Order are being taken concurrently with the proceedings under Schedule 1 of the Highways Act, 1959, in connection with the Trunk Road Order and Side Roads Order.

LAND DRAINAGE ACT, 1930

Goole and Airmyn Internal Drainage District

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 4 (3) and 14 of the Land Drainage Act, 1930, as applied by the Water Resources Act, 1963, has now made an Order confirming, with modifications, a Scheme submitted to him by the Yorkshire Ouse River Board, under section 4 (1) (b) of the Land Drainage Act, 1930, making provision for:

- (i) the constitution of the Goole and Airmyn Internal Drainage District and of the Goole and Airmyn Internal Drainage Board;
- (ii) the abolition of the Airmyn Internal Drainage District and of the Airmyn Internal Drainage Board;
- (iii) matters supplemental thereto or consequential thereon.

The Scheme affects land in the Municipal Borough of Goole and the Parishes of Airmyn and Hook in the Rural District of Goole all in the County of the West Riding of York.

The Order will become final and have effect as an Act of Parliament unless during the period ending

with 4th March 1968, a memorial is presented to the Minister by some person or body affected and having an interest sufficient for the presentation of a memorial (as prescribed in Article 6 of the Land Drainage (River Authorities) General Regulations 1965, S.I. 1965/443) praying that the Order shall be subject to special parliamentary procedure.

A copy of the Order, together with a copy of the modified Scheme and of the map prepared in relation to the Order, has been deposited at the offices of the Town Clerk, Council Offices, Goole, at the offices of the Yorkshire Ouse and Hull River Authority, 21 Park Square South, Leeds 1, and at the offices of the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, Room 410, Great Westminster House, Horseferry Road, London S.W.1, for public inspection during normal office hours within the period ending with 4th March 1968.

DISEASES OF FISH ACT, 1937

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food has made the Diseases of Fish (Infected Area) No. 2 Order, 1968 (S.I. 1968 No.).

This Order declares the Northumbrian River Authority area other than the river Tweed, to be an infected area for the purposes of the Diseases of Fish Act, 1937 and provides for control of the movement of live fish, eggs of fish and foodstuff for fish out of the area.

The Order came into force on 27th January 1968.

WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY ACT, 1949

The Postmaster General hereby gives notice to all holders of "Broadcast Receiving Licences (Including Television)—General Form" (under paragraph 7 of the Schedule thereto), to all holders of "Broadcast Receiving Licences (Including Television)—Multiple form" (under paragraph 7 of the First Schedule thereto) and to all holders of "Broadcast Receiving Licences (including Television)—Hotels Comprehensive form" (under paragraph 7 of the First Schedule thereto) that on and from the 8th February 1968, the terms of the said Licences are hereby varied as follows:—

- (1) Clause 1 (b) thereof shall be varied so as to read as follows:

"to use the said apparatus for the purposes of receiving (i) visual images sent by television which can be exhibited by the said apparatus in monochrome only and messages sent by telephony from authorised Broadcasting Stations for general reception, and (ii) visual images sent by television which can be exhibited by the said apparatus in monochrome only and messages sent by telephony or telegraphy from licensed amateur stations".

- (2) The following clause shall be added at the end thereof:

"This licence does not authorise the use of any apparatus for the purpose of receiving visual images sent by television which can be exhibited by the apparatus otherwise than in monochrome".

NOTE. A fresh licence is required authorising the reception of television in colour.
