KINGSWOOD URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Kingswood (Regent Street and High Street) (Traffic Regulation) Order, 1968

Notice is hereby given that on the 6th February 1968, the Kingswood Urban District Council made an Order under sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, the effect of which is:

 (3) to prevent any vehicle waiting, loading or unloading between the hours of 8 a.m. and 9.15 a.m. and between the hours of 4.45 p.m. and 6 p.m. on any day not being a Sunday, Saturday, a Bank Holiday, Christmas Day or Good Friday, in any of the lengths of road specified in the Third Schedule hereunder.

- (4) to revoke the Kingswood (Regent Street, High Street and Adjoining Roads) (Prohibition of Waiting and Unilateral Waiting) Order, 1966. and, insofar as that Order relates to the length of Two Mile Hill Road which is now within the area of the Kingswood Urban District Council, the City and County of Bristol (Two Mile Hill) (No Waiting) Order, 1961.

Exceptions are provided in the Order to allow vehicles to wait as long as may be necessary to enable persons to board or alight and goods to be loaded or unloaded (except as provided in paragraph (3) above) and to enable vehicles to be used in connection with building operations, public works and funerals and to enable vehicles to wait as long as may be necessary in the lengths of road specified in the Schedules hereto when the vehicles are being used in connection with a marriage or funeral at a place of religious worship.
