REPORT OF THE NATIONAL BOARD FOR PRICES AND INCOMES

Remuneration of Solicitors

On 9th February 1967, in pursuance of their powers under section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the First Secretary of State and the Lord Chancellor referred the question of the Remuneration

The Board has now made its report, and in accordance with section 5(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966 the Secretary of State for Economic Affairs and the Lord Chancellor hereby give notice that the report was first published as Command Paper Number 3529 on 8th February 1968.

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday the 16th February 1968, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £140,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5.000. £10.000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday the 19th February to Saturday the 24th February 1968, inclusive, and will be due 91

days after date.
3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank

of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
