HODDESDON URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

Hoddesdon Urban District Council—Public Footpath No. 61 (Carneles Green to Cold Hall Green) Public Path Diversion Order, 1967.

Notice is hereby given that on the 7th February 1968 the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

Its effect is to divert the public right of way running from Carneles Green to Cold Hall Green being that part of Public Footpath No. 61 which starts on the west side of Carneles Green Road at a point 150 yards north-west of Carneles Green and runs for a distance of 150 yards; onto a line which starts on the west side of Carneles Green Road at a point 230 yards south of the junction of White Stubbs Lane and Carneles Green Road and runs generally south-west for a distance of 150 yards to re-join the original footpath. The old footpath will be closed and the new footpath opened for use by the general public with effect from the 7th March 1968.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, High Street, Hoddesdon, between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

The Order becomes operative as from the 16th day of February 1968, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.
