

Hastings, and certified copies of the amended development plan or certified extracts thereof have also been deposited at the office of the Borough Engineer and Surveyor, 37 Wellington Square, Hastings.

The copies or extracts of the development plan so deposited will be open for inspection free of charge by all persons between the hours of 08.30 and 17.30, Mondays to Fridays.

The amendment became operative as from the 17th February 1968, but if any person aggrieved by it desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1962, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the making of the amendment, he may within 6 weeks from the 17th February 1968, make application to the High Court.

The amendment relates only to the proposals for the deletion of an area of 4.2 acres previously shown as allocated primarily for residential use and situated to the south of properties at Barley Lane and east of properties in High Wickham.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING GENERAL DEVELOPMENT ORDER 1963

Land at O.S. 9280 and 0480, Sandy Bay Holiday Park in the Urban District of Exmouth. Article 4 Direction.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Housing and Local Government has approved a Direction under Article 4 of the above-mentioned Order submitted to him by the Devon County Council.

The Direction stipulates that the permission granted by Article 3 of the said Order shall not apply to the development specified in the Schedule hereto.

The use of land (other than a building or the curtilage of a building or the site or curtilage of a building which has been demolished in consequence of war damage) for any purpose except as a caravan site on not more than twenty-eight days in total in any calendar year and the erection or placing of moveable structures on the land for the purpose of that use.

Class V—Uses by Members of Recreational Organisations

The use of land other than buildings and not within the curtilage of a dwellinghouse for the purposes of recreation or instruction by members of an organisation which holds a certificate of exemption granted by the Minister of Housing and Local Government under section 269 of the Public Health Act 1936 and the erection or placing of tents on the land for the purposes of that use.

Street Inner Relief Road

Notice is hereby given that consequent upon the construction of the Street Inner Relief Road, the County Council of Somerset and Urban District Council of Street, as Highway Authorities, pursuant to section 108 of the Highways Act, 1959, propose to make application to the Magistrates' Court sitting in the Petty Sessional Division of Wells City and County, at the Court House, Glastonbury, on the 19th day of March 1968, at 10.30 a.m., for Orders stopping up and/or diverting portions of the highways partly in the parish of Walton and partly in the urban district of Street, described in the Schedule hereto.

Detailed plans showing the effect of the proposals are on deposit at the offices of the Street Urban District Council, Street, Wells Rural District Council, Wooley Hole Road, Wells, and at the Walton Post Office.
