PRIVY COUNCIL OFFICE

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 14th day of February 1968.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas by the Burial Act 1855, it was, amongst other things, enacted that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, should or should not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, might seem fit:

And whereas an Order in Council was made on the 13th day of September 1854 hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order" directing the discontinuance of burials in, amongst other places, the burial ground of the Cathedral of Winchester:

And whereas Orders in Council were made on the 13th day of May 1887, the 30th day of April 1894, the 14th day of July 1899, the 16th day of May 1904, the 10th day of May 1905, the 8th day of May 1919, the 14th day of July 1922, the 4th day of May 1923, the 26th day of June 1941, and the 16th day of May 1966, varying the principal Order:

And whereas it seems fit to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that the principal Order, as varied by the above-mentioned Orders, in so far as it affects burials in the burial ground of the Cathedral of Winchester should be further varied:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said Orders shall have effect subject to the following exception or qualification, viz.:—

That notwithstanding anything in the principal Order, as subsequently varied, the burial may be allowed in that part of the Cathedral burial ground called the Great Water Close, situate on the South side of the Lady Chapel, of the body of François, son of the Reverend Canon Emanuel Amand de Mendieta; Provided that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

HIGHWAYS ACT 1959

Public Paths Diversion Order 1968

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State in pursuance of his powers under section 112 of the Highways Act 1959, after consultation with the Haverfordwest Rural District Council proposes to make an Order for the diversion of public footpaths at Barry Island Farm.

The draft Order relates to land situate in the Parish of Llanrhian the effect of the Order will be to divert parts of the public rights of way,

- (a) running from point A on footpath No. 5 from its junction with footpath No. 4 in an easterly direction to point B to a line running from point B at its junction with footpath No. 5 and continuing north to point C and then westerly to point D overlooking Traeth-Llywn.
- (b) running from point F on footpath No. 4 near the public conveniences in a north-easterly direction to point A then north to point E overlooking Traeth-Llywn to a line running from point E at its junction with footpath No. 4 in a westerly direction past Carn Llwyd to point J adjoining the boundary of Barry Island Farm overlooking Aber-Eiddy Bay.

A copy of the draft Order and of the map contained in it has been deposited at the offices of Haverfordwest Rural District Council, Cambria House, Haverfordwest, and at the Welsh Office, Summit House, Windsor Place, Cardiff, and may be inspected during normal office hours, Mondays to Fridays inclusive.
