The Trunk Road (Newark Road, North Hykeham) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1968

The Minister of Transport has made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 the effect of which is to prohibit waiting between 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. in that length of the Bath-Cheltenham - Evesham - Coventry - Leicester - Lincoln Trunk Road (A.46), known as Newark Road in the Parish of North Hykeham in the County of Lincoln, Parts of Kesteven:

- (a) on both sides from a point 70 yards south-west of its junction with Moor Lane to a point 100 yards north-east of that junction; and
- (b) on the north-west side from a point 100 yards north-east of its junction with Moor Lane to a point 10 yards north-east of its junction with St. Aiden's Road.

Exceptions are provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein

maintenance of the road or the services therein.

The London-Bristol Trunk Road (Prohibition of Waiting) (Clearways)

The Minister of Transport intends to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, the effect of which will be:

- (1) to prohibit waiting on any of those main car-riageways forming part of the London-Bristol Trunk Road A.4 which are specified in the Schedule hereto; and
- (2) to prohibit waiting by any vehicle for the purpose of trading, unless the goods are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle, on any verge or lay-by adjacent to the said main carriageway.

The prohibition imposed by the Order will not apply:

- (a) to a vehicle waiting upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform;
- (b) so as to prevent a vehicle from being used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or of any of the services therein;
- (c) to a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
- (d) to a vehicle being used by or on behalf of a local authority for the purpose of collecting household refuse or clearing cesspools;
- (e) to a vehicle waiting in any case where the person in control of it:

(i) is required by law to stop;
(ii) is obliged to stop to avoid an accident; or
(iii) is prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside his control and cannot remove the vehicle from the main carriageway.
