*The Bullingdon Rural District Council (No. 9
Marston) Public Path Diversion Order, 1967*

Notice is hereby given that on the 21st February 1968, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert the public right of way which runs in a southerly direction from the Victoria Arms Public House, Old Marston, to the Oxford City boundary, at a point 816 yards south of the said Victoria Arms Public House to a new line which runs in a more south-south-easterly direction for a distance of 213 yards to the point marked B on the plan deposited, and thence proceeding along its original line in a southerly direction to the Oxford City boundary.

The old path will be closed as from the 3rd April 1968.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the Council Offices, 76 Banbury Road, Oxford, and may be inspected, free of charge, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

A copy has also been deposited with the Clerk to Marston Parish Council at 31 Oxford Road, Marston, where it can be inspected, free of charge, at all reasonable times.

The Order becomes operative as from the 1st day of March 1968, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any Regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order, he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.

*The Bullingdon Rural District Council (No. 17
Lewknor) Public Path Diversion Order 1968*

Notice is hereby given that the above Order on the 21st February 1968 is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The effect of the Order will be to divert the public right of way which runs across land at Bald Hill Lewknor in the County of Oxford commencing at a point situate approximately 230 yards east south-east of Icknield Way and running in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 750 yards to a point approximately 260 yards north-west of the Portobello Road to a new line which will commence at the point first above-mentioned and proceed in an east south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 280 yards thence in a south-easterly direction for approximately 500 yards and thence in a south-westerly direction for approximately 140 yards to join up with the existing footpath.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the Council Offices, 76 Banbury Road, Oxford and may be inspected free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays.

A copy has also been deposited with the Clerk to Lewknor Parish Council at The Old Bakery, Postcombe, where it can be inspected free of charge at all reasonable times.

Any objection or representation concerning the Order may be sent in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, before 30th March 1968, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

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- (iii) Cross Street from its junction with Oldgate Lane (C.98) for a distance of approximately 100 feet in a northerly direction.
- (iv) Silver Street from its junction with Oldgate Lane (C.98) for a distance of approximately 100 feet in a northerly direction.
- (v) Abell Street from its junction with Oldgate Lane (C.98) for a distance of approximately 100 feet in a northerly direction.
- (vi) Wood Street from its junction with Oldgate Lane (C.98) for a distance of approximately 100 feet in a northerly direction.

8. To prohibit waiting by vehicles for a longer period than 30 minutes in any 2 hours between the hours of 8 a.m. and 8 p.m., Mondays to Saturdays inclusive on the following lengths of road at Thrybergh:

- (i) The southern side of Oldgate Lane (C.98) from its junction with Cross Street to the eastern boundary of the Supermarket building.
- (ii) The southern side of Oldgate Lane (C.98) from the eastern boundary of St. Peter's Churchyard to its junction with Wood Street.

The above Orders are subject to the usual exemptions.

9. That no person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle on the un-named road connecting Broomfield Road and Bracken Moor Lane at Stocksbridge, in the Stocksbridge Urban District, otherwise than from east to west. An exception in the Order enables the use of mechanical road cleansing vehicles between the hours of 7.30 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Copies of the Orders and of maps showing the lengths of road affected may be inspected during normal office hours at the offices of the County Council of the West Riding of Yorkshire (Room 87), County Hall, Wakefield.

*Modification of Particulars Contained in the Revised
Rights of Way Map and Statement in Draft
Form.*

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of the Administrative County of Surrey, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by subsection (3) of section 29 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, have determined to modify the particulars contained in the revised rights of way map and statement in draft form prepared under section 33 of the above-mentioned Act in relation to the rights of way within the area of the said County Council by the change of status of the section of Right of Way No. 3, between Chaldon Church and Leazes Avenue from footpath to that of bridleway.

A map indicating this determination has been deposited at the County Hall, Kingston upon Thames, and at the offices of the Caterham and Waringham Urban District Council, and may be seen there, free of charge, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays.
