

The Scheme affects land in the Municipal Borough of Maldon; the Urban Districts of Brightlingsea, Clacton, West Mersea and Wivenhoe; the Parishes of Goldhanger, Great Totham, Little Totham, Tolleshunt, Tolleshunt D'Arcy, Tolleshunt Knights, Tolleshunt Major in the Rural District of Maldon; the Parishes of East Mersea, Fingringhoe, Great and Little Wigborough, Langenhoe, Peldon, Salcott and Virley in the Rural District of Lexden and Winstree; and the Parishes of Alresford, Elmstead, Frating, Great Bentley, Great Bromley, St. Osyth and Thorington in the Rural District of Tendring.

The Order will become final and have effect as an Act of Parliament unless during the period ending with 16th April 1968, a memorial is presented to the Minister by some person or body affected and having an interest sufficient for the presentation of a memorial (as prescribed in Article 6 of the Land Drainage (River Authorities) General Regulations 1965, S.I. 1965/443) praying that the Order shall be subject to special parliamentary procedure.

A copy of the Order, together with a copy of the Scheme and of the map referred to therein, has been deposited at the Offices of the Colchester Borough Council, Town Hall, Colchester, at the Offices of the Clacton Urban District Council, Town Hall, Clacton-on-Sea, at the Offices of the Essex River Authority, Rivers House, Springfield Road, Chelmsford, and at the Offices of the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, Room 410, Great Westminster House, Horseferry Road, London S.W.1, for public inspection during normal office hours, within the period ending with 16th April 1968.
