WATER RESOURCES ACT, 1963

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR LICENCE TO ABSTRACT WATER

Notice is hereby given that an application is being made to the Kent River Authority by The Dover Engineering Works Limited, Dour Iron Foundry, Dover, Kent for a licence to abstract the following quantities of water from an existing well in the chalk underground strata of the Works yard at the following point of abstraction: a maximum of 30,000,000 gallons of water per annum, 120,000 gallons per day and 12,000 gallons per hour at Dour Iron Foundry, Dover at the point marked "A" on the map accompanying the application.

This abstraction has been taking place since 1930 and the quantities now applied for are comparable to the quantities abstracted prior to 1st April 1965.

A copy of the application and of any map, plan or other document submitted with it may be inspected free of charge at the Head Office of the Dover Engineering Works Limited, Bridge Street, Dover, Kent, at all reasonable hours during the period beginning on 15th March 1968 and ending on 15th April 1968.

Notice is hereby given that an application is being made to the Dee and Clwyd River Authority by the Wirral Water Board for a licence to abstract an additional overall quantity of fifteen million gallons per day from the River Dee at their Deeside Intake and Pumping Station (National Grid Reference SJ407658) in the City of Chester and at their Heronbridge Intake and Pumping Station (National Grid Reference SJ412643) in the City of Chester.

The quantity of fifteen million gallons per day forms part of the total quantity which the Liverpool Corporation are authorised to abstract by virtue of the Liverpool Corporation Act 1957 and is temporarily surplus to that Authority's requirements.

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CHARGING SCHEME

Notice is hereby given that the Trent River Authority (hereinafter called "the Authority") have submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for his approval a Charging Scheme prepared under section 58 of the Water Resources Act, 1963.
