### REPORT OF THE NATIONAL BOARD FOR PRICES AND INCOMES

Increases in Rent of Local Authority Housing

On 12th December 1967, in pursuance of their powers under section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the Secretary of State for Economic Affairs, the Minister of Housing and Local Government, the Secretary of State for Scotland and the Secretary of State for Wales, referred for examination to the National Roard for Prices and Incomes the research for and Board for Prices and Incomes the reasons for, and phasing of, increases in rents of local authority hous-

phasing of, increases in rents of local authority housing, with particular reference to the increases in rents by the authorities named in the schedule to the reference and to any proposed rent increase affecting tenants of the Greater London Council.

The Board has now made its report, entitled "Increases in Rents of Local Authority Housing". In accordance with section 5(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the First Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity, the Minister of Housing and Local Government, the Secretary of State for Scotland and the Secretary of State for Wales hereby give notice that the report was first published as Command Paper No. 3604 on 25th April 1968.
