
The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Minister of Housing and Local Government that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued as hereinafter directed in St. Cuthbert's Churchyard, Blyth, in the County of Northumberland, which is shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto, has in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 4th day of March 1968, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 1 of the Burial Act, 1853 (1853, c. 134), and of all powers Her enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:

- 1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in St. Cuthbert's Churchyard, Blyth, in the County of Northumberland, which is shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto.
- 2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (St. Cuthbert's Churchyard, Blyth, Northumberland) Order, 1968.
