Notice is hereby given that the above Orders made on the 2nd day of July 1968 are about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Their effect will be to:

- (a) extinguish the public right of way on the part of Bridleway 77 from the junction with Bridleway 91 through Higher Sweetcombe Farm, Sidbury, to the junction with Bridleway 78; and
 (b) divert the public rights of way from the Existing Routes to the corresponding New Routes described below.

*Public Rights of Way**Existing Route**New Route*

Part of Footpath 56	From the field gate east of White Cross along the bottom of Filcombe Goyle to the occupation road at the foot of the south-western side of Bald Hill.	From the said field gate along the top of Filcombe Goyle to the said occupation road.
Part of Footpath 72 Sidbury	From the A.375 Sidmouth-Honiton county road about 380 feet south of Synderborough Lane in a north-easterly direction towards and then along Pen Hill to a point about 500 feet east of "Shatterway".	Along the A.375 and Roncombe Lane to the linhay about 400 feet west of Sand Farm through the field gate, and then south-westwards and northwards along the edge of the field towards and along Pen Hill to a point about 500 feet east of "Shatterway".
Parts of Footpath 127 and 130 Salcombe Hill	West of South Combe farmhouse: (i) from the junction with Footpath No. 130 across O.S. Field Nos. 1400 and 1603 to the north-east corner of the field; (ii) from the junction with Footpath No. 131 to a point about 335 feet north-west thereof.	From the point where Footpath No. 131 commences at the cliff edge for a distance of 1300 feet in a north-easterly direction to the north-east corner of the said O.S. Field No. 1603.
Part of Footpath 130 Salcombe Hill	Along the path at the southern side of "South Down".	Along the southern side of the hedge and bank adjoining the southern side of "South Down".
Part of Footpath 132 Salcombe Regis	From a point about 1100 feet north of Salcombe Mouth for a distance of 500 feet across O.S. Field No. 5309.	Along the eastern side and part of the northern side of the said field.
Part of Footpath 153 Bulverton Hill	From a point about 40 feet south of the southern boundary of the property known as "Longmeadow" through the said property to a point about 50 feet north of the northern boundary of the property.	Outside and along the western boundary of the property between the two points described in the previous column.

Notice of Confirmation of Public Path Order

Rural District Council of Wantage (Upton F.P.10) Public Path Diversion Order, 1968

Notice is hereby given that on the 8th day of July 1968, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

Its effect is to divert part of the Upton Footpath No. 10 from a point marked A on the map, approximately 350 yards West of the Blewbury Parish Boundary where it crosses Footpath 11, 858 yards North East of Skeleton Farm, running in a Westerly direction for a distance of 638.3 yards to a point marked B on the map, 700 yards North-East of Angers Farm to a line commencing at point C on the map, approximately 108 yards South-West of the aforementioned point A and 750 yards North-East of Skeleton Farm, running in a North-Westerly direction for 530 yards to a stile at point D on the map 925 yards North-East of Angers Farm. It then proceeds in a South-Westerly direction for 225 yards to the said point B where it rejoins the original line of F.P.10. The new line of the path

will become available for use and the old one closed on the 5th August, 1968.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at, and may be inspected free of charge, at the Council Offices, Belmont, Wantage between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12.30 p.m. and between 2 p.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

The Order becomes operative as from the 18th July 1968, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order, he may within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.
