#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday the 23rd August 1968, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, and the National Loans Act, 1968, to the amount of £170,000,000.

  2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000 or £250,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday the 26th August 1968, to Saturday the 31st August 1968, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less 4. Each l'ender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 11 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated to be dated.
- 7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
  8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
- 9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

#### DEPARTMENT OF EMPLOYMENT AND PRODUCTIVITY

#### PRICES AND INCOMES ACT 1966

Reference to the National Board for Prices and Incomes of a settlement relating to the pay of certain workers employed in the thermal insulation contracting industry, and notice of a direction in relation thereto under section 15 of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966.

The First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity (hereinafter referred to as "the Secretary of State"), acting in pursuance of her powers under section 2 (1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, hereby refers to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for their report the settlement reached on 25th January 1968, by the National Joint Council for the Thermal Insulation Contracting Industry providing for increases in the hourly rates of wages of thermal insulation engineers, labourers over 18 years of age and apprentices employed in the thermal insulation contracting industry.

By virtue of the aforesaid reference the Secretary of State, acting in pursuance of her powers under Section 15 (1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, hereby directs that the said Section 15 shall apply to the settlement specified above.

This reference and direction take effect on the date of this issue of the Gazette.

The direction that Section 15 of the Prices and The direction that Section 15 of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966 shall apply results in a standstill on the implementation of the settlement referred to in the direction until the publication (not later than 3 months from the date of reference) of the Board's report on the reference. It should also be noted that, by virtue of Section 1 of the Prices and Incomes Act 1967, the standstill may continue beyond the publication of the Board's report if it should contain a recommendation adverse in any respect to the implementation of the said settlement.

The Trunk Roads (Various Roads, Carmarthen) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) (Experimental) (Variation) Order 1968.

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State intends to make an Order under sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, the effect of which will be to vary the Experimental Order now in force in the Borough of Carmarthen.

Instead of vehicles being prohibited at all times from waiting on the side of road specified in the Schedule to this Notice it is proposed to restrict vehicles from waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday for a longer period than 30 minutes, in any one hour.
