HOUSE OF LORDS

Whereas upon the 31st day of October 1967, the House of Lords resolved that whenever during the present Session of Parliament the House stands adjourned, and it appears to the satisfaction of the Lord Chancellor (or if the Lord Chancellor is unable to act owing to illness or other cause, to the satisfaction of the Lord Chairman of Committees after consultation with Her Majesty's Government) that the public interest requires that the House should meet at any earlier time during such adjournment, the Lord Chancellor or the Lord Chairman of Committees, as the case may be, may give notice to the Peers that he is so satisfied, and thereupon the House shall meet at the time stated in such notice, and shall transact its business as if it had been duly adjourned to that time.

And whereas I, William Francis, Earl of Listowel, Lord Chairman of Committees, in the absence of the Lord Chancellor and after consultation with Her Majesty's Government, am satisfied that the public interest requires that the House should meet at a time earlier than the said adjournment, that is to say at 2.30 o'clock on the 26th August 1968.

Now, therefore, I William Francis, Earl of Listowel, Lord Chairman of Committees, by virtue of the power vested in me by the said resolution hereby give notice that I am so satisfied, and that the House should meet at 2.30 o'clock on the 26th August 1968.
