He has fortify'd Pausitypo, with the thands of Nibida and Procita, and set out several Arm d Barks for the sensity of the Coatts. Letters from Corracchio advise, that the Imperialities were still busy in erecting Figures, and Fortifying that Places, where they were to receive several Pieces of Cannon, and great Stores of Ammunition. Count Marsigli, after having review'd the Arsenals of the Vatican, and the Cathle of St. Angelo, had likewise taken a Survey of the Coals, and of the Frontier of the Kingdom of Naples, from whence he was return'd to Rome, with intention to set out with all expedition for Ferrara. The Pope has order'd Levies to be made in all parts of his Dominions. He has fent his Gallies to Marseilles, to Convoy the Ves-He has fent his Gallies to Marfeilles, to Convoy the Veifels on which the Troops are embark'd that have been rais'd at Avignon; and, at the same time, to bring over feveral Officers whom the French King has promised to fupply him with to Command his new Levies. The French King has also afford him, that he will fend to his Allisance all the French and Irish who are now in Sicily. Commissions are given out to several Roman Gentlemen, who undertake to raile their Men at their own Expence. on which conditions the Marquis de Ruspoli Expence, on which conditions the Marquis de Ruspoli has undertaken to make up a Regiment of 1000 Men. But notwithstanding these Preparations on each side, it is considerably reported, that there are Negotiations on Foot to accommodate their Differences; by the Mediation of the Elector Palatine, and the Great Duke of Tuscany. It is said the Queen of Poland will very suddenly leave Rome, it appearing, at present, impossible to accommodate the Differences between Hor Majesty and the Pope. The Court of Rome have lately-receiv'd Advices from China, which give them very great disquiet. The Bishop Maigrot is arriv'd from thence, where he has been for some time a Prisoner; and brings Accusations against the Jesuis in that Kingdom, for complying with an Edict of the Emperor, which enjoin'd the Worship of Conficults the great Chinese Saint.
