The Acquisition of Land (Authorisation Procedure) Act 1946

Notice is hereby given that the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Hemel Hempstead in the County of Hertford acting by the Council of the said Borough in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the above mentioned Acts on the 13th day of August 1968 made a Compulsory Purchase Order entitled "The Borough of Hemel Hempstead (Marlowes No. 2) Compulsory Purchase Order 1968" which is about to be submitted to the Minister of Transport for confirmation, authorising them to purchase compulsorily in connection with the improvement of the highway known as Marlowes in the said borough the land or interest described in the schedule hereto. A copy of the Order and of the map referred to therein have been deposited in the Town Hall, Hemel Hempstead, and may be seen there during office hours. *Notice of Confirmation of Public Path Order**Footpath No. 17—Parish of Caddington**Public Path Diversion Order No. 1—1968*

Notice is hereby given that on the 13th day of September 1968 the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed, with modifications, the above Order.

Its effect is to divert the public footpath three feet in width running from a point marked "A" on the map approximately 330 yards from its junction with Mancroft Road, Aley Green, first north-west across field No. OS 105 and then in a westerly direction along the northern boundary of the said field and across field Nos. OS 100, 99 and 98 for a total distance of 620 yards to a point marked "B" on the map at its junction with Millfield Lane, north of Millfield Farm, to a footpath three feet in width running from a point marked "D" on the map approximately 35 yards south of the said point "A" in a southwesterly direction along the northern boundary of field No. OS 91 for a distance of 540 yards to a point marked "C" on the map at its

junction with Millfield Lane approximately 170 yards south of Millfield Farm. The old path shall be extinguished at the expiration of 21 days from the confirmation of this Order.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, Sundon Road, Houghton Regis, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. (Mondays to Fridays).

Any person who wishes to claim compensation as a result of the coming into operation of this Order, should apply in writing to the Luton Rural District Council, Council Offices, Sundon Road, Houghton Regis, before the 1st day of April 1969.

The Order becomes operative as from the 19th day of September 1968 but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.
