The Prince and Landgrave of Haffia is gone from hence to Rome, his Princels and Son have taken their way towards Germany.

On Saturday last the Dutchess of Cori was brought to bed of a Daughter, in prefence of Eight perfons and a publick Notary, whom her Husband the Marquis de Santinelli ordered to be prefent as witnesses of the truth of the birth.

The great Feast which was to have been in St Marks place on Thursday last was by reason of the ill weather deferred till the Sunday following, on which day the Bulls are to be hunted in the Court of the Dukes Pallace, and afterwards an entertainment to be given to the Ladies and persons of the greetest quality.

Ratisbonne, Feb. 18. The divertions of the Carneval have put a ftop to all affairs of graver concernment. The 16th inftant t'e Emperours High Commifficience entertained all the reft of the Plenipotentiaries and Deputies from the Electors and virinces of the Empire with an extraordinary Feaft and Banquet 3 the Brandenbourg Minifters only ablenting themlelves upon fome contention of faither which is not yet faith be ween them and the faid Prince and Bifhop of Aichfladt.

The bulinels of the publick lecurity of the Empire's in the fame pofture as formerly; the Direct ns of the Colledge are labouring at a Project to fatisfy all intereffs, and anfwer all objections arifing upon that fubject; the greateft obfracles of this affair has been the private quartels and animolities among t feveral Princes, which tis believed may in little time ad nit of reconciliation; those between the Electors of Saxony, Palatine, Mens and Triers being already composed, and those between other. Princes in a fair way to be fpeedily determined.

Monfieur de Gravelle the French Minister has been received and Treated with much respect and civility at the Court of Bavaria, and is by this departed thence for Newbourg, intending to retu n by Wartzbourg, and to have some conference with the Elector of Meniz.

Hambourg, Feb. 28. As yet the Commissioners for the compositive of the differences between the Crown of Demmark and the Duke of *Helffein Ploen* have not made any confiderable advances in that affair, the Duke having no inclination to part with what he conceives to be his right, as to the fucceffion of Oldenbourg, though very confiderable overtures have been made to him in lieu of his pretentions.

Letters of the 5th inftant from Stockholme tell us, that the extremity of the cold which has frozen up for sbove two Moneths, all the entrys into the Countrey, has hindred Mateful Wranget from his intended return to that place.

• The Senators of the Crown were expected at **Stock**holm the 15th inftant to confult about the prefent concernments of the State.

Letters of the 7th inftant from Warfaw tell us, that five of the preparatory provincial Diets are broken up with diffatisfaction upon the point of the Kings Marrisge, which fome perfons labour to perfwade the people to be dangerous and prejudicial to Poland, and the prejude to great and expensive wars. The Dietine of Great Poland is alfo broken, where the contentions amongft the Nobility, were fo very great, that frequent Duels paffed amongft them, and they were twice obliged to thut up the Church where the Convention was held, to avoid greater and more general diffurbances. The Bithop of Cracouia end exvouring, but in van to exhort them to a more quiet temper.

The King being informed of the departure of his Royal Spoule with the Emprels Dowager, and a Train of neer Ten thouland perfons from Vienna, having first given out fresh Commillions for new Asl.mblies to be held in the Provinces and Palatinates, whole Dirts were by the difunion of the Nobility broken up, lett Warfam the 7th instant in the asternoon, - and with a great Train of the principal Lords and Officers of the Crown, let forwards for Gzenflokow, having fent before him the Bishop of Plosho, to receive the Queen upon the frontiers, and to compliment her in his Majellies name.

From Leipfic they write, that the pretended Prince Cigala has been removed with a Palsport from the Prince Elector of Saxony, from thence to Nuremberg.

From Rostock they write, that the Post of Pomerania was robbed on his way thither, and wounded; and left for dead by two perfons who having committed the fact, and thinking themselves secured from discovery by the death of the Post, came with much confidence into Roflock, but the wounded perfort recovering his sences, and brought into the Town, discovered the Villains, who were prefently apprehended, and may be in little time proceeded against according to justice.

Paris, Mart. 1. His Majefty continues his Refolution of marching this Spring into Flanders, but not with that number of foot guards as was at first defigned, intending only 50 dayes continuance in those parts.

Here is lately arrived a Courier from Cathinal de Retz, who is intrufted with the management of the French concernments in the Conclave, with Letters to his Majefly, giving him an account of all his affairs there, but as yet no pr (p  $\alpha$  can be taken of the Election. The faction of the Chigi appears to have most prevalency, and Cardinal d'Elei the perforn they feem most inclined to promote to this high Dignity, but tis believed allo, the other faction may be powerful enough to exclude him.

the Arch-Bidiop of Thoulofe, formerly Bishop of Befiers, his most Christian Majesties Ambastadour to the Court of spaine, has been defined by the Queen Regene not to take his way by Saragofa the place where Don Juan keeps his Refidence, where upon he has altered his intended course taking the way of Valance.

The Marquis de Ghatillon, his Majesties Lieurenam in Rouffillon has ordered the Governor of Ville Franche in the County of Conflans, to be sent Prisoner to Perpignens, for delivering up 15 Banditi which he had Prisoners in his Castle, to a greater number of those Robbers who surprifed him in the night, and by threats obliged him to see at liberty, their Companions.

The people of Genflans in Kouffikon having diforderly got together and kille 1 14 perions, who where there overfeverely leavying the Taxes laydupon them, His Majefty has ordered the Count de Ghamilli his Lieutenant General to march thither with 4000, men to reduce them to obedience, and to fearch out and punish the principal fomenters of that diforder.

Deal, Feb. 26. Two days fince arrived in the Downs a Fleet of about Eighty fail of Merchants thips from leveral parts, and fince about Fourty fail more, whetsof Twelve from the Streights.
