The QUEEN has been graciously pleased to give orders for the undermentioned award of the British Empire Medal and for the publication in the *London Gazette* of the names of those specially shown below as having received an expression of Commendation for brave conduct.

*Awarded the British Empire Medal for
 Gallantry (Civil Division):*

Frank William EVANS, Chargehand Fitter, Royal Ordnance Factory, Bridgwater, Somerset.

A serious accident occurred in the Formaldehyde plant of the Royal Ordnance Factory, Bridgwater and a quantity of inflammable liquid escaped from the plant inside the heavily-constructed building causing an explosion followed by a fierce fire. The brick walls were forced outwards, the concrete roof and associated steelwork fell and a large section of the building was destroyed. Three men were killed by falling masonry and three others were injured. The conditions immediately after the explosion were alarming and the rescue of the various people employed in the building was carried out under extremely hazardous conditions. There was a distinct possibility that there might be further explosions, fires or falls of masonry or structural steelwork. Mr. Evans was in charge of maintenance men working in another part of the building at the time of the accident. This part had not been damaged and he escaped unhurt. After his escape he at once returned to help others and was the first to find and help release two men trapped by fallen debris on the flat roof of a low part of the building. In spite of the obvious danger of further occurrences he worked with great courage and determination until both the trapped and injured men had been released.
