PRESENT.

THE QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by sections 659 and 738 of the Merchant Shipping Act 1894 (1894 c. 60) and section 1 of the Merchant Shipping (Amendment) Act 1920 (1920 c. 2) and of all the powers enabling Her in that behalf and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows: as follows:

1.—(1) The Trinity House (Remuneration of Members) Order 1966 (Printed in the London Gazette 30th December 1966) is hereby revoked.

- (2) The Interpretation Act 1889 (1889 c. 63) shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament and as if this Order and the Order hereby revoked were Acts of Parliament.
- (3) This Order may be cited as the Trinity House (Remuneration of Members) Order 1968, and shall come into operation on the date of publication in the London Gazette (29th November 1968).
- 2. The sum to be paid to the active members of the Corporation of the Trinity House of Deptford Strond, being the General Lighthouse Authority for England and Wales, shall be £45,685 per annum in respect of the period from 1st January 1968 to 30th June 1968; £45,905 per annum in respect of the period from 1st July 1968 to 31st December 1968; and £47,120 per annum in respect of any period after 1st January 1969.

Provided that, in respect of any period during which there is a vacancy among the active members, the said sums shall be reduced by an amount equal to the sum which, but for the vacancy, would have been payable during that period to the active members concerned. member concerned.

3. The sums payable under the provisions of this Order shall be paid out of the General Lighthouse Fund.
