The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under section 9 and 13 of, and Schedule 5 to, the Import Duties Act, 1958, and section 2 (5) of the Finance Act, 1965, viz.:

The Import Duty Drawbacks (No. 10) Order, 1968.

This Order:

- (1) consolidates all existing provisions for the allowance of drawback of import duty under the Import Duties Act 1958 and, in addition,—
- (2) provides that there shall continue to be drawback of import duty in respect of certain glass parts of cathode ray tubes, notwithstanding their reclassification in a tariff heading (70.21) which would otherwise render them ineligible for drawback;
- (3) amends the provisions for the allowance of drawback of import duty on rolls of electro-sensitive recording paper so that the drawback

is related to the total quantity of paper exported and not to the paper content of each roll;

- (4) revokes the provisions for the allowance of drawback of import duty on handbags manufactured from imported leather; and

- (5) revokes the existing fixed rates of drawback of import duty in respect of photographic film and prepared film base and provides for drawback to be related to the duty paid on the imported film base actually used in the manufacture of the exported goods.

This Order comes into operation on 5th December 1968 and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1968 No. 1881.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under sections 1, 2 and 13 of the Import Duties Act 1958, viz.:

The Import Duties (General) (No. 12) Order, 1968.

Following a Classification Opinion of the Customs Co-operation Council, certain parts of glass envelopes for cathode ray tubes, hitherto classified in subheading 85.21(B) of the customs tariff, now become classifiable under heading 70.21. This Order introduces a new subheading in that heading for the parts concerned, and prescribes the same rate of import duty (20 per cent. ad valorem, full rate) as that chargeable on the parts when classified in subheading 85.21(B).

The Order comes into operation on 5th December 1968, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1968 No. 1880.
