The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under section 3(6) and 13 of the Import Duties Act 1958.

Viz.:—The Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 6) Order, 1968.

This Order provides that the goods listed in Schedule 1 shall be exempt, or shall continue to be exempt, from import duty until 1st January 1970, except for items for which an earlier day is specified. Descriptions of goods which were not exempt at the date of this Order are marked \*.

Some goods, the exemption of which is continued by this Order, appear under a description which has been modified to make it specifically clear that the exemption relates only to the normal isomer of the substance concerned: descriptions so modified are marked †.

The Order also continues until 1st January 1970 the partial exemption for photographic film base of cellulose acetate.

The Order comes into operation on 1st January 1969 and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1968 No. 1948.

### PRICES AND INCOMES ACT 1966

*Reference to the National Board for Prices  
and Incomes*

*Wages and Conditions in the Electrical  
Contracting Industry*

Wages and conditions in the electrical contracting industry for England, Wales and Northern Ireland are currently determined by a three-year agreement reached on 30th June 1966, the final stage of which was put into effect from 2nd September 1968. Wages and conditions in the electrical contracting industry in Scotland are determined separately.

In pursuance of her powers under section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity hereby refers to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for separate examination and report:

- (1) Wages and conditions of employment in the electrical contracting industries in England, Wales, and Northern Ireland;
- (2) Wages and conditions in the Electrical Contracting Industry in Scotland;
- (3) Questions related to (1) and (2) above, including the relationship of national settlements in electrical contracting to other pay settlements and in particular to site agreements.

### PRICES AND INCOMES ACTS 1966 TO 1968

Notice under section 1 (2) (a) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1967 of a proposal to make an Order under section 1 (2) (b) of the said Act, as amended by section 3 (2) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1968, continuing a standstill under section 15 (2) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966 on the implementation of an award relating to terms and conditions of employment in the road passenger transport undertaking of the Great Yarmouth County Borough Council.

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice of a proposal to make an Order under section 1 (2) (b) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1967, as amended by section 3 (2) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1968, in the terms set out at the end of this notice. The effect of this Order will be to continue until 9th August 1969 the standstill on the implementation of

the undermentioned award which was applied under section 15 (2) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966 by virtue of a reference to the National Board for Prices and Incomes under section 2 of that Act made on 10th September 1968, that is to say the award made on 4th September 1968 of a bonus payment of 10s. per week to employees in the transport undertaking of the Great Yarmouth County Borough Council in connection with the extension of one-man operation during the 1968 summer season.

The standstill referred to was continued under subsections (1) and (2) (a) of section 1 of the said Act of 1967 by virtue of a recommendation of the Board adverse to the said implementation contained in their Report on the said reference published on 6th December 1968.

Representations about the proposal may be made by or on behalf of employers or employees affected by the said award, or by or on behalf of any employers' organisation, trade union or trade union organisation directly or indirectly representing employers or employees so affected, to the Secretary of State in writing addressed to the Department of Employment and Productivity, 8 St. James's Square, London S.W.1, not later than 27th December 1968.

After that date, and subject to the consideration of any representations duly made, the proposed Order may be made in the following terms:

Whereas by virtue of a Reference to the National Board for Prices and Incomes under section 2 (1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966 (1966 c. 33) (the text whereof was published on 10th September 1968 in the *London Gazette*) the implementation of the award described in Article 2 hereof relating to terms and conditions of employment in the road passenger transport undertaking of the Great Yarmouth County Borough Council was forbidden by section 15 (2) of that Act;

And whereas before the said implementation ceased to be so forbidden a Report of the Board on the said Reference was published (Report No. 96 entitled "Pay of Busmen employed by the Corporation of Great Yarmouth" (Cmnd. 3844) published 6th December 1968) with a recommendation adverse to the implementation of the said award;

And whereas by virtue of the said recommendation and subsections (1) and (2) (a) of section 1 of the Prices and Incomes Act 1967 (1967 c. 53) the said section 15 (2) continued to apply to the implementation of the said award as it applied up to the date of publication of the said Report:

Now, therefore, the Secretary of State having given notice under section 1 (2) (a) of the said Act of 1967 within a period of ten days after the date of the said publication, of a proposal to make this Order, and having taken into consideration representations duly made in pursuance of the said notice, in exercise of the powers conferred on her by section 1 (2) (b) of the said Act of 1967, as amended by section 3 (2) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1968 (1968 c. 42), and of all other powers enabling her in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:

1.—(1) This Order, which may be cited as the Awards and Settlements (Temporary Continuation of Standstill) (No. 3) Order 1968, shall come into operation on 4th January 1969.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889 (1889 c. 63) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. The Secretary of State hereby directs that section 15 (2) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966 shall continue to apply to forbid the implementation up to and including 9th August 1969 of the award made on 4th September 1968 of a bonus payment of 10s. per week to employees in the transport undertaking of the Great Yarmouth County Borough Council in connection with the extension of one-man operation during the 1968 summer season.
